BACK TO SCHOOL MESSAGE

Based on numbers and current absenteeism in our buildings, we will transition to full on-site instruction for all students in grades PK-6th starting Tuesday, September 22, as planned. Grades 7-12 students will continue with the hybrid model through October 9. A decision to move to full on-site instruction or continue in the Hybrid Model the week starting October 12 will be made by October 2.

COVID-19 REPORTING

College Community Schools has introduced a <u>COVID-19 Reporting Document</u> and <u>Reporting A Positive Case After Hours form</u>. The COVID-19 Reporting document is updated at the end of each week and shows current cases, numbers of students and staff in quarantine, and the number of contact tracing investigations completed to date. QUARANTINE, ISOLATION, and CONTACT TRACING

The situation with this pandemic has introduced us all to new vocabulary as we implement our processes to maintain health and safety. <u>This document</u> outlines the difference between *quarantine* and *isolation* and is a helpful reference for families to know what to do when a member of their household is ill or when a member of their household must quarantine.

ISOLATION occurs when:

Your student has been diagnosed with COVID-19 OR

Your student is waiting for their test result OR

Your student has symptoms of COVID-19 but has not been tested or exposed.

QUARANTINE occurs when:

Your student has been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-

19. Exposure means that they were within six feet of the person who tested positive for more than 15 minutes, with or without face masks. (Many people ask "If students will have to quarantine with or without masks, then why do we require face masks to be worn?" This is because face masks reduce the risk that students will become infected with COVID-19 after they've been in close contact with someone who is positive.)

It is important to remember that we require students and staff who are ill with COVID-19 symptoms to stay at home or to return home if they become ill during the school day. Parents must pick up their children within 30 minutes of being notified by the school that their child is ill. Contact tracing and quarantining will not occur, however, until there is a positive test result.

In a future communication, we will describe the process of contact tracing that our school teams go through when we have a report of a student or staff member who tests positive.
