What does it look like?

Rarely

Not often or seldom

More often than not, the student does not demonstrate the Habit of Success

Less than 25% of Interactions

Occasionally

Infrequent or irregular intervals of applying the Habit of Success

25-50% of the Time

Frequently

More often than not

Developing regularity in practice

50-80% of the Time

Consistently

Regularly with a few exceptions

80-100% of the Time

How can I help my student?

Talk with your students about the importance of education, respect, responsiblity, and persistence.

Use growth-mindset language with your student, like "not yet," "I can see you worked hard on that," or "It seems like you're trying a new strategy." You can check out Mindset Works for Parents.

Praise your student when you see him or her being respectful or responsible. You can use the stems from the descriptors as feedback.

Attend conferences or communicate with your student's teachers in a way that best fits your needs.

Ask your child about how he or she was respectful, responsible, or persistent at school.
