

**The Family Visitation Center of Linn County** opened its doors in 2012 as the **only** family visitation center in Iowa offering **free** supervised parent/child contact and monitored exchanges of custody to Linn county residents.

## Services

#### Supervised Visitation is contact

(approximately an hour long) between a parent and child which is overseen by a neutral third party.

**Monitored Exchange** is the supervised transfer of a child from one parent to the other parent using a safe location and a third party to supervise.

**Fees** There is no cost associated with FVC services.

# Safety is our highest priority.

FVC utilizes a combination of technology and nontechnology based measures of security such as: surveillance cameras, access controlled doors, separate entrances, individualized safety plans, staff well trained in domestic violence, and a working relationsl The Family Visitation Center of Linn County (FVC) is a community resource that recognizes the importance of providing services to families affected by domestic violence. Young children who witness domestic violence (or who are involved in high-conflict child custody disputes) are more likely to have socialemotional problems as adolescents and adults. (Source: CDC).

#### Goals

- Keeping children safe from witnessing further violence between adults in their family
- Supporting the abused parent's decision to end the relationship with the abusive parent
- Eliminating face-to-face contact between the abused parent and the abusive parent
- Supporting the abused parent in feeling they can safely comply with the level of supervised visitation granted to the visiting parent by the court
- Eliminate the risk that children will be physically abused or abducted during visitation or exchange.
- Substantially reduce the risk of emotional harm during visitation or child exchange.

# **Referral Process**

- Court order, self-referral, or referral by a community agency or organization (attorney, law enforcement, social services, domestic violence agency or batterer education program.)
- Children must be in the custody of one or both parents. FVC cannot provide services to children in foster care or protective custody of courts or social service agencies.
- Each parent is responsible to contact FVC to schedule a separate orientation session.
- FVC takes into consideration individual circumstances, personal safety needs and concerns and level of risk to victim and the children, before admission to program can be made.
